### Being Resolved

If I am honest, I rarely keep any New Year resolutions that I make much longer than January. More often than not, I resign myself to realize that my best kept resolution was about 10 years ago when I resolved to no longer make resolutions. I could be really snarky and theologically fancy and presume that by living in God's glorious grace, the only resolution to which I need to ascribe is to be constantly trying to sin less. While this may be true, it really would just be a cop out and would require little effort on my part, again, ascribing to God's abundant grace to pick me up when I fall.

Resolving to do something is not just a way to be healthy, begin a new habit, end an old habit, or otherwise be a better human; rather it is, at least in the lives of Christians, a way for us to constantly be better tomorrow than we were yesterday or today. It is a way for us to seek first the Kingdom of God and God's righteousness, while also seeking to acknowledge and repent of our sins--known and unknown.

Thankfully, someone a few hundred years ago sat down and thought through what it might look like to be resolved to live a more Christlike life. Rev Johnathan Edwards, famous for his sermon "Sinner's in the hand of an angry God" formulated a list of 70 resolutions that he tried to accomplish, EVERY WEEK!! Arguably the greatest American theological mind, Rev. Edwards made his list known in an effort to be held accountable. My hope for all of us at FPC St. Albans is to read the list, at least once; that's right, just once. Hopefully in doing so we'll be motivated to read it again, if not any sooner than next January when I remind you about it once more.

I first read his list of resolutions in seminary, and each year I bring it back out to read through it again. It can be, initially, daunting. However, I do not think Rev. Edwards would have ever intended anyone to be intimidated by his list. The humility with which he writes his resolutions is something that inspires me to be a better human, husband, father, pastor, and certainly Christian. I hope you enjoy, and perhaps are inspired by, the 70 resolutions of Rev. Edwards. My personal favorite resolution is #36. Perhaps in due time you can share your favorite with me.

Their oldest daughter is Makenzie who is a Neuro Surgical/Trauma ICU Nurse at Allegheny General Hospital in Pittsburgh. She and her fiancé Matt are getting married in February in Orlando, FL. Mark is doing the service. Their son Miller is currently taking a break from college during the pandemic. He enjoys skateboarding and cooking. Our daughter Moria (rhymes with Gloria) is an 8<sup>th</sup> grader who loves art, especially to draw using colored pencils. ## from the DCE

***“...trust in God and return to him. Be loyal and just, and wait patiently for your God to act.” ~ Hosea 12:6***

Has a “Happy New Year!” ever been so desired as this January first? Jimmy Fallon’s December 17 edition of the Tonight Show aired ‘2020: the Musical’ and declared 2020 the year that lasted 30 years. The musical nailed the misery and desperation so many of us felt when isolated for weeks that dragged on and on into months. Like seeds planted in the dark earth, we are emerging to the light and promise of the New Year.

2021 offers us grand opportunities to take advantage of the best of 2020 and put that best into action to the glory of God. The Church is now out of the box, out of our buildings, out of our fortresses, and we must do what we can to make our new station fruitful for our Lord Jesus.

Jesus’ whole ministry was out of the box. Yes, he spent time at the temple, but mostly *he was on the go*. People watched for him and followed him through towns as though his arrival deserved a parade. Even tax collectors welcomed the sight of him. Zaccheus was called down out of his high post to be host to our Lord and Savior. Hospitality was turned inside out.

And that is what the Holy Spirit calls the church to this day, *inside out hospitality*. We must cease rushing to return to normal and attempting to co-opt the Holy Spirit, for the Spirit has need to be outside the confines of our human made structures, our “box.” It is time to tip over the Holy Cows and let go of cherished traditions, practices and programs that no longer serve our Lord’s purpose. The 2020 global pandemic bears witness to this need.

Our focus is redirected and sharpened by the pandemic. We again appreciate and value what we already have, instead of working mindlessly and grasping toward the lures of culture. Relationships regained their priority. Instead of pining for normal, we discover better.

We found out that we are not falling apart, we are just getting rid of pieces that no longer serve

us. Spiritual surgery is painful. As F. Scott Fitzgerald said, “Vitality shows not only in the ability to persist, but in the ability to start over.”

The pandemic has brought the great emergence Phyllis Tickle wrote about to the forefront. God is working in the pandemic to bring about a new chapter in the history of Christianity. Know that God did not create the pandemic, but walks with us through it, holding our hand and leading us out of the darkness. We are never alone, and we are no longer the people we were at the beginning of 2020. We have been made new. Hold on tight to Jesus for the promises of 2021 present a new song and dance.

Listen for God. Trust the Spirit. Love the people. Share the Good News and use words if need be.

Weems’ poem *In December Darkness* begins, “The whole world waits in December darkness for a glimpse of the Light of God.” And ends with, “as the whole world looks starward ... watching for an angel with rainbow wings to announce the Hope of the World.”
